## About the choral anthem

George Matheson, born 1842, wrote the text of our choral anthem. At age 20, he was engaged to be married but began losing his eyesight. When he broke the news to his fiancee, she decided she could not go through life with a blind husband, and she broke off their engagement.

George's eldest sister cared for him for the next twenty years. With her help in completing his studies, he entered pastoral ministry. His blindness forced him to memorize his sermons. Nonetheless, he had a prolific preaching ministry.

In time, George's sister was married, leaving him bereft of care. Although he did not begrudge her joy of living her own life, he undoubtedly felt very much alone. On the night of her wedding, he began to meditate on the unfailing love of God for him, penning his most famous hymn: *O love that wilt not let me go*.

It speaks of the Christian response to God's great love for us: that we are to dedicate our lives in service to him. In doing so, Jesus assures us of both earthly and eternal joy, saying in Matthew 16:25, "whoever loses his life for my sake will find it."

I found tremendous comfort in this hymn during the years I cared for Mom. Amid the uncertainty of how long the season of caregiving would last and what difficulties lay ahead, I could sing "I give thee back the life I owe" not only to God, but to Mom, after a lifetime of love and care she gave to me.

Finally and ultimately, the text reminds us that no matter what trials we face in this life, we can be confident that God's promise in Revelation 21:4 is not vain: "He will wipe away every tear from [our] eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning, nor crying, nor pain anymore, for the former things have passed away." Indeed, that morning in the new heavens and the new earth shall tearless be!
